2012 Oklahoma QSO Party Results

Although Space weather was not as good as last year, as can be seen by this Aurora taking place on the evening before the contest.



The weather on the ground was good so it was fun to start the spring season with a QSO party after the "non Winter" here in Oklahoma. Others must have had the same idea. We had good participation allowing N6MU to complete a 77 county sweep.

IN STATE RESULTS Fixed SO-HP

Dave, W5CW took the controls of K5CM's station in Muskogee County again, with1253 Q's and 106 mults for a score of 290,016. As with last year most of Dave's contacts came Saturday on 20 meter SSB. Sunday was spent looking for in state mults.

Second place went to N5AQ with 411 CW Q's and 87 mults.

Fixed SO-LP

Doug N4IJ/5 in Oklahoma County Made 411 CW Q's with 74 Mults. Jeff WD0GTY also in Oklahoma County was not far behind with 325 Mixed Q's and 60 Mults.

Fixed SO-QRP

Gene W5LE had fun operating a new category, for him, with a first place finish with 200 Q's and 90 Mults. That's an excellent Mult count for QRP! Ken K5KC operated on both phone and CW making 220 Q's and 62 mults.

OKM-ASSISTED

Bob, W0BH did a repeat and took first place in this category. Bob was the over all winner of the OKQP with 1817 Q's and 67 mults, for a score of 313,694. Bob was assisted by Lorna, K0WHY. Check out the soapbox for a run down on his FB operation.



Connie, K5CM was assisted by Pam, N5KW who did most of the driving and some of the SSB operating, for a second place finish with 1383 Q's and 67 mults for a score of 246,292. As with last year most of Connie's Q's were on CW.

OKM-Non Assisted CW

Norm, W5DYA finished in first place in this category with 592 CW Q's and 56 mults.

OKM-Non Assisted Mixed

AI N5UM finished first place in mixed mode with 893 Q's and 56 mults.

AF5Q had a good showing with 449 Q's and 49 mults.

OUT OF STATE RESULTS Single-Op HP

N4PN operating both phone and CW almost had the sweep this year. Paul operating from Georgia made 297 Q's with 75 mults, for a score of 68,900. Paul had the most bonus points with 11,000.

K4MIA took the 2^{ND} spot with 119 Q's and 59 mults.

Single-Op LP

I know this is an old picture but a little nostalgia never hurts, especially if it shows three great operators. That would be W5LE, N6MU, and K5YAA, from the 2007(?) OKQP.



John, N6MU operating mixed mode made the sweep this year with 301 Q's and all 77 Mults. AF5Q gave him the last county with only 8 minutes left. Great going guys!!!

Second place goes to Don, N5XG, with 108 Q's and 69 mults. W4UCZ, from GA takes the third spot with 98 Q's and 67 mults. W4UCZ is first place in CW only.

Single-Op QRP

K3TW operated mixed mode to take first place in the 5-watt class. He had 232 Q's and 64 mults, for a score of 48,156.

N4JF operating from Alabama came in second with 143 Q's and 60 mults, for a score of 30,920. The third spot went to W4UT from TN.

DX Single-Op HP

Despite poor E/W conditions, JO7WXN managed 4 Q's and 4 mults.

DX Single-Op LP

YV5OIE takes first place here with, 76 Q's and 49 mults for a score of 14,584.

<u>W0BH</u>

After a long "non-winter" in Kansas, Lorna/k0why and I were both ready to fire up the van and run a QSO party. My goal this year was to pick up most of the remaining south and southeast counties that we hadn't yet run in the OKQP. I planned a route starting at my dad's farm in Grant county in the north, then jumped on I-35 and headed south. The route was mostly good highway and fast, so we had 34 counties on the schedule.

The equipment in the Chevy Astro hasn't changed much from previous QSO parties and was mostly in place in the van. When I started checking things out, I found that a mouse had been inside my Heil noise-cancelling headset case and chewed through the main cable. That was the only damage and the mouse had moved on, but I had to swap to an older MFJ headset with less audio gain. Lorna likes to give out Qs from time to time, and she listens to the Icom 706 audio through the FM radio. This time, instead of the FM radio, I added an audio booster and plugged in a speaker which worked really well.

Saturday

After an early farm breakfast, we headed out into a cloudy, not too cool morning .. my idea of perfect QSO party weather. It's always a challenge to fight the glare on the computer screen, but no eyestrain this year. John/N6MU was waiting for me on my posted 40m, frequency and we logged QSO number one. The first half hour was slow, then the three county line appeared and we were off. N4PN, K4ZGB, K3TW/QRP and WF2S joined the fray and kept us company throughout the weekend. The quick chit-chat with the "regulars" is one of my favorites parts of the QSO party experience, and this year it was even more fun than usual.

Our route took us through the west side of Oklahoma City. When things slowed down, I tuned around looking for other OK stations and found WD0GTY in Oklahoma county. We got steadily closer and passed about a mile from his QTH, so we were able to work a number of different bands on ground wave. While sitting at a line south of Oklahoma City, another ham drove by and noticed us parked. Lorna chatted with him for a bit while I worked down a big CW pileup.

The day continued along smoothly and the 60 minute line stops gave Lorna time to relax and even do a bit of bird-watching. We were running slightly behind as we closed in on our last county for the day, but arrived with ten minutes to spare and lots of eager ops. As the sun went down, we also picked up huge bug splats (some type of beetle). As the clock ran out, we were 15 minutes from our overnight stop .. a historic bed & breakfast called the Old Johnson House in Hugo. When I made the reservation, the proprietor, Mitra, told me she used to be a ham, and her dad, Chris/W7LMB had just moved in. We really enjoyed our visit with both of them out on the patio in almost tropical conditions as they asked about QSO party mobile operations.

Sunday

As we approached the intersection, a white car with an HF antenna on the back stopped at the intersection, then continued rapidly south without seeing us.
